BILLS AND COMMUNICATIONS

M. Henry would like to thank the company for sending a card to his wife. Kelley just started a new treatment in New Jersey and they are very optimistic. He appreciates all of the prayers; please keep them coming as they seem to be working.

The Board of Elections would like to use both stations for polling locations. This will occur on September 13th from 10:30 until 22:30 and on November 8th from 05:15 until 22:30.

BOARD COMMUNICATIONS

Discussion regarding the detailed apparatus outlook plan which Bill created. He looked at the logs to determine how often each rig is used. He's asking for input from the chiefs regarding the condition of each piece of apparatus and if they are meeting our needs. He has a tentative plan for replacing each one; this will become more accurate as he adds new information.

Discussion regarding FEMA grants, which are coming up very soon. It was decided that we will pursue a grant to replace the brush truck.

Discussion regarding credit versus debit card for company use. At this point Bill favors a debit card, but will seek out more information about the pros and cons of each type of card. Mark H. brought up his concerns about having all of our funds located at the same bank; Bill will look into diversifying the location of our money.

OFFICER REPORTS

CHIEF:

- All fire extinguishers have been checked and put back on the apparatus.
- Hose check was done and all passed. Thanks to Tom Mason for his help with this.
- Cyanide sensor for the 5 gas meter on the Squad is now on order with no delivery time available.

FIRST ASSISTANT CHIEF:

• If you are a driver, stay with your rig unless you are told otherwise.

SECOND ASSISTANT CHIEF: No report.

DAY CAPTAIN: Not present.

NIGHT CAPTAIN: Not present.

FIRST LIEUTENANT: Vacant.

SECOND LIEUTENTANT: Vacant.

FIRE POLICE CAPTAIN: Not present

MAINTENANCE:

 Utility still has to get serviced locally, but everything else has been done. Numerous repairs were made at Har-Rob to all rigs which will enhance our safety. Overall our apparatus is in good shape. We have a solid 5 years of planning for new rigs. Every 3 to 5 years the apparatus should go to Har-Rob, but next year maintenance costs should be at least half of what they were this year. The Squad has new brake pads; please take it easy on them. Rescue has new brakes all around. Two additional water leaks were found on the pumper tanker which are being repaired, but it is still in good shape and is in service.

AIR/CASCADE:

- The gauge is fixed on the Rescue.
- Bottles and packs are all in service.
- There are old-style amplifiers in the back room which may be issued to the people with the highest response to calls at some point in the future.

EMS: (Report given by Mark H.)

- As far as Mark H. knows, nobody gave any input regarding the joint training between EMS and Fire.
- Class for CFR recertification was cancelled due to lack of interest.

TRAINING:

- Wednesday and Saturday trainings have been going well.
- The new smoke machine reportedly worked really well.
- I will try to get a class set up in a couple of weeks for our meters. I'll try to get a salesman to come in with a power point to answer our questions. (Mark H. says that if you smell gas around a gas meter, even if nothing registers on the 5-gas meter, shut off the gas and let NYSEG handle it.)
- If anyone has any requests to do anything at training, let me know.
- We will be going to Vestal soon for a live burn.

HEALTH/SAFETY: No report.

FIRE MARSHAL:

- We are looking at upgrades for the Firehouse software.
- ISO review was started and should be done by late summer.

SAFETY OFFICER:

• The temperature is rising and so is the humidity; dress for the conditions and STAY HYDRATED.

AUDIT: No report.

PARADE:

• Deposit parade is August 10th for their 200th birthday.

SOCIAL:

 It was brought to our attention that we should have voted on whether or not to have a summer party as 2% money is being used. The party is on August 13th at Country Pines.

(If you are an active member but are unable to attend the annual meeting and have not paid your dues, somebody in the company will probably loan you \$1 so that you won't become a member not in good standing).

- A motion made to accept the bylaw proposal as it is written with the exception of \$1 for dues by G. Roberts, seconded by M. Belensky.
