BILLS AND COMMUNICATIONS

We sent them a \$100 gift certificate as a thank you for allowing us to use their barn for Engine 1 to keep it out of the elements during the construction on Carrie Ann Dr. They returned it to us, expressing their thanks that the rig was available on Carrie Ann Dr. during the construction. They would like it to be donated to a needy family in the community.

BOARD COMMUNICATIONS

- Mark H. will be calling T. J. Madison again about getting an estimate for repairing the back wall at Station 1. He has called twice and they have not returned his calls. We have already received a check from the insurance company for repairing the wall.
- We will be purchasing the signage for both stations. Thanks to Adrian for working on this.

- Adrian has a friend who has looked into the fixing the ditch in back of Station 1. A major problem will be where the dirt can be dumped. It may have to be carried out a bucket at a time.
- The land deal is in the hands of the lawyer as the seller accepted our offer for 2 acres and we are waiting for the final paperwork to come back from the lawyer.
- Air system at Station 1 still needs to be looked at as it takes so long to fill tires. Mark H. thinks the pressure switch needs to be replaced because it is not maintaining a high enough pressure.
- Paper towel dispensers for Station 1 are in the budget for 2012. Adrian will pick up the roll-type dispensers and they will be installed.

• Congratulations to the members who received their green tags this Saturday (D. Kerila and J. Brown) at the live burn training. Congratulations to G. Greenlee for getting signed off on the pumper tanker and the Squad.

FIRST ASSISTANT CHIEF:

- Beginning in 2012 there will be construction on 38B past Stratton Road which will cause the road to be shut down to one lane. There should be no issues with this for us.
- There is no start date for the bridge project on Nanticoke Drive.

FIRE POLICE CAPTAIN: No report.

EMS:

- Run card changes were done to have the fire company dispatched for all CPR calls. Available personnel can respond directly to the scene if EMS people are already there. Bring the EMS rig if it has not gone out.
- The chiefs and I had a discussion last month and additional crew chiefs will be given first-in bags and radios so that they can respond directly to the scene. This will be on a trial basis.
- We now have EpiPens, which were backordered for quite awhile. They will be on EMS 53 and the pumper tanker. They must be protected from freezing and they

cost \$300. If somebody takes EMS 53 home, the medication has to come inside in cold weather.

• Things went really well with rehab at live burn training on Saturday. We came up with a list of things we can get to increase our capacity, like additional chairs and blood pressure cuffs. We tried to educate everyone as they went through rehab as to what our objectives were and what we hope to accomplish.

FIRE MARSHAL:

MAINTENANCE:

- At the Route 38B MVA, crews did a good job and worked well with Maine, which was noticed by them as well. Keep up the good work.
- Training at Vestal this past Saturday went well. It was nice to have the rehab tent set up and being used. Remember that rehab is for everyone's safety. Thanks to Chief Hoyt for inviting Maine Fire as mutual aid training is a good thing.
- New air bag is in service on the Squad, replacing the one that failed.

- The gauge on the Cascade is working now.

- The live burn training went well. We are looking to set up some more training with Maine Fire up at the Maine tower.

- D. Kerila and D. Hoeflein completed Firefigher 1 (congratulations!)

Adam was born with rare congenital birth defects and is facing complex surgeries. He has already had eight surgeries and is scheduled for four more this summer. Motion was seconded by B. Bealo:

• Regarding the nominations for February 4, 2012 elections:

The Board received a written objection to the nomination of A. Silvestri and J. VanKuren for the chief and assistant chief positions. A written objection is supposed to address the qualifications for the positions as outlined in the bylaws. While valid points are made, the objection for A. Silvestri does not specifically address these qualifications. The objection about J. VanKuren has to do with the fact that he resides outside the district. The Board discussed this extensively and we have decided that since the membership voted not only to waive the residency requirement for him but also elected him to a captain's position, and as there is no mention in the bylaws of a residency requirement for the assistant chief positions, then J. VanKuren's residency cannot prevent him from running for the assistant chief positions.

Per the bylaws each office has specific requirements, which are primarily education requirements and length of service time. In some cases we know that the classes have not been taken and that the requirement for length of service time has not been met. In other cases we don't yet have the documentation that the education requirements were fulfilled. We are going to remove the all of the names from the nomination board except those of the people we know are qualified at this time. J. Hardik has also removed her name as she does not wish to run for EMS Captain at this time. D. Hill and J. VanKuren temporarily removed their names from the board as well.

We have removed a lot of names from the nomination board, but per the bylaws we can waive qualifications if need be. According to the bylaws, this is done by a vote of the membership.

At the annual meeting we will first vote on all positions where qualified members are running. We will then vote on whether or not to waive qualifications for each of the positions that have no qualified people running. The Board will make some recommendations, but ultimately the membership determines which qualifications will be waived. If the membership agrees to waive qualifications, then whomever was nominated and now meets the new qualifications will be allowed to run in the election. We will then vote to fill the remaining offices.

Our problem with this situation is that absentee ballots will be extremely difficult to manage. A discussion with the membership was held regarding what we can do to manage the absentee ballots, which we are NOT required by the bylaws to make available.
