BILLS AND COMMUNICATIONS

Kelley Henry is doing much better and appreciates all of the support being given to her as her cancer treatment continues.

Broome County Health Department announces "National Child Passenger Safety Certification Course" to be offered at the Broome County Sheriff's Office on April 17th-20th from 08:30 to 17:00. (Discussion regarding whether or not we should participate in this for liability reasons.) We decided that we will provide our station as a location for the sheriff's department for the installation of car seats.

BOARD COMMUNICATIONS

We have estimates for the repairs for the flood damage to Station 1. B. Dieffenbacher will be bringing this information to the FEMA representative. Decisions regarding these repairs are forthcoming.

A. Green ordered the signage for Station 1 and it should be arriving in the very near future.

The land deal is in the hands of the lawyers and we are awaiting an update, but according to our last information it appeared that things were progressing well.

We are ordering 20 black chairs similar in style to the ones that we already have for Station 1.

Key fobs will be issued to the members of the auxiliary.

OFFICER REPORTS

CHIEF: No report.

FIRST ASSISTANT CHIEF:

- Maine Fire is changing their run card. We will run the tanker and Squad to structure fires for mutual aid. This hasn't been changed at the County level yet; please listen to the dispatcher carefully. This arrangement will get manpower on the scene faster due to the greater number of members operating out of Station 2.
- Especially within the last month, the training that people have received has been noticed and has been very well-received. Keep up the good work.

SECOND ASSISTANT CHIEF:

• This is probably the busiest year that we have had on record and we have made it through with zero work-related injuries, thanks to our training and everyone watching out for one another.

DAY CAPTAIN:

- Everything is going well with training.
- Please send an e-mail out to the membership if you are setting up Engine 98. We are running Engine 98 again next Friday. There is still one seat left (as of now).
- Keep up the good work.

NIGHT CAPTAIN:

• Engine 98 crews please send out a quick text to let people know that Engine 98 is in service via IAMRESPONDING.

FIRST LIEUTENANT: Vacant.

SECOND LIEUTENTANT: Vacant.

FIRE POLICE CAPTAIN: No report.

EMS:

- The hitch to pull the rehab trailer has been installed on the EMS. There is a draw bar and ball in the passenger side rear door compartment. The 4-to-7-prong electrical adapter is on the trailer and is to stay there. I will be doing trailer qualifications for non-EMS members who are not yet signed off on driving the EMS/trailer combo. If you are qualified to drive the utility/trailer, you can drive the EMS/trailer as the two are very similar.
- A couple of our active crew chiefs are going to be issued first-in bags and radios as per our announcement last month regarding this.
- Congratulations to S. Bealo and Chris Dyer (mutual aid from Maine) who have completed recertification and are back in active service as crew chiefs.
- EMS training will be Thursday, 02/16/2012 at 17:00 at Station 1. The entire rehab training program will be the topic.

FIRE MARSHAL:

 I talked to the gentleman from ISO this week. Our report is submitted to the next level. None of our numbers were changed. Official report will be arriving in 2 to 3 months. (Discussion about getting recommendations to improve our numbers). I will get information from ISO about improving our numbers.

SAFETY OFFICER: No report.

MAINTENANCE:

- Repairs to the Squad were completed last week, including repairs to the leaking generator.
- Thank you to T. Mason, D. Hill and their assistant L. Hill (Logan) for taking care of the dead battery on the pumper-tanker.

AIR/CASCADE:

- Air packs were all flow-tested for 2012 and all passed. All have new batteries in them. No problems were noted with the regulators this time, so not using tap water at Station 2 appears to have fixed that problem.
- Make up fit testing is next Saturday at 09:00 at Maine Fire. Bring your mask and get in line if you have not had fit testing yet.

- Incentive program will be sent out soon. I am working through a few discrepancies but will send it out in the near future.
- Congratulations to J. Mann and B. Gazdik for completing Introduction to Fire Officer.

• Regarding the nominations for February 4, 2012 elections:

The Board received a written objection to the nomination of A. Silvestri and J. VanKuren for the chief and assistant chief positions. A written objection is supposed to address the qualifications for the positions as outlined in the bylaws. While valid points are made, the objection for A. Silvestri does not specifically address these qualifications. The objection about J. VanKuren has to do with the fact that he resides outside the district. The Board discussed this extensively and we have decided that since the membership voted not only to waive the residency requirement for him but also elected him to a captain's position, and as there is no mention in the bylaws of a residency requirement for the assistant chief positions, then J. VanKuren's residency cannot prevent him from running for the assistant chief positions.

Per the bylaws each office has specific requirements, which are primarily education requirements and length of service time. In some cases we know that the classes have not been taken and that the requirement for length of service time has not been met. In other cases we don't yet have the documentation that the education requirements were fulfilled. We are going to remove the all of the names from the nomination board except those of the people we know are qualified at this time. J. Hardik has also removed her name as she does not wish to run for EMS Captain at this time. D. Hill and J. VanKuren temporarily removed their names from the board as well.

We have removed a lot of names from the nomination board, but per the bylaws we can waive qualifications if need be. According to the bylaws, this is done by a vote of the membership.

At the annual meeting we will first vote on all positions where qualified members are running. We will then vote on whether or not to waive qualifications for each of the positions that have no qualified people running. The Board will make some recommendations, but ultimately the membership determines which qualifications will be waived. If the membership agrees to waive qualifications, then whomever was nominated and now meets the new qualifications will be allowed to run in the election. We will then vote to fill the remaining offices.

Our problem with this situation is that absentee ballots will be extremely difficult to manage. A discussion with the membership was held regarding what we can do to manage the absentee ballots, which we are NOT required by the bylaws to make available.
